


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SPRING HAS ARRIVED!

Dear Friends,

The first half of this year has been filled with so many surprises! At each turn, we saw the Lord at work - increasing our partnerships with churches, enabling us to scale up community outreaches, and seeing more precious lives pointed back to Him.

In just the first 4 months, our STREETKIDS child rescue & recovery programme has expanded by more than 50%; requiring us to bring forward our building project so there would be sufficient accommodation space for the new kids.

The runway was short, and we were uncertain if we could raise the needed sum, but nevertheless we started in faith. Right at the middle of the construction project, a substantial sum came in from an anonymous donor. And just before the building project was completed; all the needed funds were in!

These breakthroughs continued across all our programmes - our Hope scholars graduated at the top of their classes, community drug use decreased to 8% (from 10.9%), and our field ministry received the outstanding organisation award from the local government.

It's clear that no aspect of the ministry is left untouched by His grace and provision; and we believe the Lord is just getting started! With the influx of lives and increased ministry tempo, our priority is now to onboard more ministry workers, so we can scale up our outreaches.

This is where the Frontline Fund comes in.

The Frontline Fund is a dedicated fund aimed at <u>increasing our ministry staff and expanding our outreaches.</u> We need to raise roughly \$28,000/month, or \$335,427/year; and your help is needed. Do prayerfully consider chipping in, as this is our <u>biggest need at the moment.</u>

May your hearts be encouraged as you read through the following pages, and may our reflections and learnings inspire you - to follow Him - wherever He leads, whatever the cost.

HINENI - THE HEART OF MISSIONS

Missions is more than just something we do. Missions actually starts from a place of right spiritual posture.

I want to share something about the posture for Missions. And I think one key posture for missions is founded on a Hebrew phrase found in the OT. **HINENI.**

HINENI is Hebrew for here I am – it appears 17 times in the 4 Hebraic canonical books of Genesis, Exodus, Samuel and Isaiah.

HINENI is made up of two Hebrew words – HINE – Behold – NI – ME

Uttered most often in response to God

- Moses responded to God at the burning bush
- Samuel responded 3 times when God called
- Abraham replied to God when he was asked to offer his own only son as sacrifice
- Isaiah offered himself when called by God (Isaiah 6)

HINENI "Here I am" is not the same as another HINIHNI – "I am here" they are very close in Hebrew but have different meanings.





"I am here" means you know what is to be expected and you are here to do it.

"I am here for this missions trip with a clear agenda, a planned assignment."

"I am here to accomplish this task - that's my mission."

But HINENI – "Here I am" is when you are giving full attention to the one who calls you, without knowing what is to come, without knowing what is to be assigned.

And that's terrifying. Because it means you are putting your entire trust on the One who calls you.

So when God called Abraham, he said HINENI – he didn't know what was to come, and then GOD said, "Sacrifice your son."

When Isaiah heard God call, "Who shall go?" He said HINENI – Here I am, not knowing what was to come.

Then GOD sent him on an impossible mission – to the stubborn Jewish people who would be refuse to heed God's Word to repent and return to covenant.

HINENI - THE HEART OF MISSIONS

And at the heart of it, this is the HINENI for MISSIONS. For God's Kairos moments in Missions are to be met by our HINENI moments.

Where we say, God, I don't know what you will call of me, I don't know where you will send me, I don't even know what to expect when you give me this assignment, when you put in my heart this burden, I don't know but HERE I AM. This is my HINENI for you.

Here I am, GOD. Because You are worthy, You are holy, You are set apart so now set me apart with my HINENI for you.

Send me to your harvest field, which is ripe and ready for harvest – right here in this nation and land.

It <u>is not</u> "I AM HERE to do a task which I am certain of"

IT <u>is HERE I AM</u> – doing whatever you call me, even when that is going to stretch me, test my faith, throw me out of my comfort zone.

Today will you say, Lord, HERE I AM? This my surrender, my availability to you. But my friends, before you say HERE I AM, we need to FIRST encounter GOD's HINENI.

Our HINENIs are met by the HINENI of God – Isaiah 58:9a "Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer, you shall cry, and he will say, "Here I am"

We need to encounter the HINENI of God before we can offer our own HINENI.

It is when you hear HIM say to you, "Here I AM" – you are not alone. I am here with you, I am here for you. I love you. I will anoint you. Then are you able to give your HINENI to the Lord.

So take time to SEEK him, REST in His love and grace, then RECEIVE his call to the assignments and burdens He gives.

May God give us all the grace to say HINENI, HERE I AM, LORD. I am your servant – be it unto me, according to Your purposes and your will. AMEN.

LEARN: RETHINKING MISSIONS

It was probably 15 years ago, when we first organised the StreetKIDS Camp, a 3D2N learning camp, that enabled village kids to step out of their village for the very first time; and to see the world outside.

This project was in response to the high drug use, affecting rural kids, and most of these kids were from the lower income group. Many of these kids felt that they would just have to grow up living in the same place, and suffer the same plight as their parents. There seems to be no way out of the poverty trap, and the vicious drug cycles.

It would not have been too difficult to do school talks on drugs, but it had already been done, with minimal success. We caught a glimpse that the issue was not simply in education, was much deeper - how do we tell the kids that the world is bigger, that they could dream, and they needn't resign to fate?

We prayed, and gave this issue much thought, before landing on a radical idea.

Do you remember the first time you visited a science center? a firestation? or a hospital? And only to come back, dreaming of becoming a astronaut, a pilot, a firefighter, a nurse or a doctor?

Having an inspiration is a great start, but we all need people to believe in us. And the same goes for these kids - they need someone to believe in them.



There was this hunch - that if kids have something to aspire towards, they are more likely to pay attention in classes, less likely to drop out, and therefore more likely to stay away from drugs.

But if we are only fixated with reducing drug use, we have missed the bigger picture, and forgotten why these kids use drugs in the very first place.

If you had a honest conversation with the ones struggling with addiction, words such as "void", "emptiness", "the need to be accepted", "forgetting my struggles" or "numbing the pain inside".

If you notice the words carefully, it has little to do with what happens outside, but what lies inside - Its a cry for help, for acceptance, and to be loved.

LEARN: RETHINKING MISSIONS

So how do we create a programme that is not just educational, but deeply meaningful?

The secret lies in the word "compassion".

The word "compassion" gets thrown around quite a bit in the missions world. We think of "compassion" as having mercy on someone else. But in the latin root, the word compassion is made up of 2 words "com-" as in together, and "pati-" to bear/suffer.

Compassion therefore isn't just having mercy, but to have a willingness to suffer together - to walk with someone through their most painful moments, to share in the sorrows, and journey with them.

Mark 1:41 "Moved with compassion, Jesus reached out and touched him. "I am willing," he said. "Be healed!"

When our Lord said that he had compassion, it wasn't just love from heaven, but Christ came, walked and journeyed with the leper, and us in our deepest moments of pain.

We started to receive teams, teaching them to rethink missions - to go beyond just giving, serving and doing. But to understand what compassion - com-pati looks like. To be present, to journey with the kids, to know each one by name, to look beyond the surface, and to love them without condition.

The word spreads, not because it was a great opportunity for kids but because every child that walks in, experiences a wonderful love, an acceptance and a hope that words can't fully describe.

So what does it look like for the community? In the 4-5 years that followed, we saw a unprecedented drop in addiction - halving juvenile drug use from 25% to 10.9%.

As we gear ourselves for missions, remember that its not the programme, but the people who truly matters.

Tread softly. Walk gently. And Love unconditionally.

HOPE SCHOLARS TOP THEIR COHORTS


Our first group of HOPE Scholars have graduated.


3 of them have emerged as first class honours, and amongst them are educators, architects, accountants, and our very first dentist!



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
