## IN SPITE OF...

Dear friends, donors and benefactors,

In the last 6 months, we have been seeing unprecedented breakthroughs across all our ministries: our StreetKIDS programme **expanded by up to 150%**, more community **first responders have been trained** & equipped, we have seen a **surge of local volunteers** coming alongside us, and our year-end Christmas celebration reached 667 lives - **exceeding our current hall's capacity by more than two-fold.** 

These are things that we have not seen in the past 17 years of ministry; and they have all happened in the last year. It has been almost like a new breath of air filling our lungs!

But the year wasn't all easy - to say the least. Chiangmai was hit by the most severe flooding in recent history, reaching depths of 5.2m. Cars were submerged, water levels were neck-deep for some of our neighbours, and our premise was not spared either. It was deeply painful.

There is an ongoing narrative about how we ought to serve God with our surpluses - of time, talents and treasures. This is correct, but incomplete; **because what we do, in spite of the circumstances, is what defines us as Christians.** 

In the midst of the flooding, our colleagues went out, door to door, to ensure that none of our elderly neighbours were stranded, that every family had enough clean drinking water, and made sure that even the poorest had a mosquito net to brace themselves for the surge of insect-borne diseases.

They went, **simply believing that this is the very thing that He would do**. And as much as our colleagues poured out their lives, you too came alongside us - pouring out your heart and resources, enabling us to reach more than 4,453 lives through the crisis.

As you look through the following pages, may your hearts be encouraged and faith strengthened. I have also penned 2 writings that may be helpful for those who are thinking of serving, or are rethinking missions.

I hope you will enjoy reading this edition of JOURNEYS!

## KNOW: IS OUR WORLD DROWNING?

Disasters: earthquakes, tsunamis, typhoons, wild fires; displaced people, refugees, violence.

These are often the things you will see on the newspapers, TV and perhaps on your social media feeds.

## The world can feel bleak, the needs overwhelming. Just how bad is our world?

If you asked any group, an overwhelming percentage of people will tell you that the world is getting worse by the day.

And if you ask any group of Christians, we will view it as a sign that this world is not meant for us.



### But is the world truly getting worse?

Actually on the contrary - it's actually getting better, according to a multi-year research by Dr Hans Rosling, a Swedish professor, scientist and researcher.

In his award-winning book "FACTFULNESS" he offers a pop quiz of the world, backed by real world data.

The results are remarkable.

A few key points from the research show that

- in the last 20 years, extreme poverty has almost halved
- deaths per year from natural disasters have decreased 75% in the last 100 years, and
- more than 85.3% of the world have some access to electricity

#### What this means is that:

More people are surviving disasters, more deaths are being prevented, more children are surviving life-threatening diseases and now, more infants are surviving not just because there are incubators, but also electricity to power these life support machines.

The world is indeed more hopeful, despite and in spite of what we read on the news every day.

So why does our newsfeed contradict these real world statistics?

Simply because the mundane, the regular, the simple acts of kindness, don't attract as much attention, as sensational stories.

But yet, it is in the mundane, the routine, the slow passage of time, that good work is truly been done.

Love not so much a dramatic event, rather than a series of quiet, mundane sacrifices, over a period of time. - The gentle hands of love, the consistent love of a mother, a father, quietly sacrificing material comfort for their children.

That's the same love that perhaps Christ has for us; the same love that works behind the scenes, changing our world, saving lives, transforming communities while we slumber.

The world is indeed hopeful (more hopeful than we dared to believe); but do we notice it? Do we see the hands of God through the passages of time?

Maybe this verse from the bible is apt.

Isaiah 43:18-19 "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

This is a call for us, to re-examine our worldview, and prepare ourselves - for something is (already) happening!

Note what is said.

"Forget the former things" - our presuppositions, our assumptions and perhaps our worldview.

"do not dwell..." - do not persist, linger and hang on to things of the past

"see, i am doing a new thing" - a call for us to witness, to watch carefully

".. It springs up" - it's coming forth, it's unexpected.



Something is happening! Let's read on

"I'm making a way" **He** is creating

- way in the wilderness (inroads into new areas),
- streams in the wastelands (restoration in places of brokeness)

God is actively at work, not passively. God has not left the world to dwindle, quite the opposite.

And for me it's clear, if the Lord is all out, for the good of the people, so am I! Take heart my friends. This is just the beginning!

# LEARN: ASSET-BASED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Before we can talk about asset-based community development, we need to talk about what the opposite is.

It is called deficit-based community development, and we are all guilty of this at some point of our lives.

To be deficit-based is to focus on identifying and servicing needs.

Asset-based community development (ABCD), by contrast, builds on the assets that are found in the community, mobilizing individuals and groups to realise and develop their strengths.

In short, it's working to uplift the community for the long haul, rather than just providing short-term, interim and temporal aid.

# LEARN: ASSET-BASED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

So what does asset-based community development look like at RADION?

Many years ago, we noticed that 7 in 10 elderly patients came to our clinics with Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) - a disease affecting the lungs, and most often seen amongst heavy smokers.

What caught our attention was that the majority of these patients were non-smokers. So where did the COPD come from?

So we decided to investigate - visiting the families, the living conditions, seeking to understand the culture.

Families will live in a wooden shed, having a shared bed, and right next to the bed was a fireplace, that served as a kitchen as well as a warmer.

And there it was - a humble metal ring that served as prop to hold up pots while the firewood burns beneath it.



The fireplace will be left burning right at the bedside, with the ash filling the lungs of the families that lay their heads to rest.

We asked if the villagers would be able to move the stove out of the house, however the response was always the same - that if they left the metal ring outside the house, it will be stolen. That metal ring was worth a day's wage or more.

So together with our teams, we started an initiative, to encourage families to put these stoves outside their homes, and should a ring go missing, we would pay for a new one!

Gradually families moved their stoves out, and the number of rings that were stolen were none. For everyone had a ring of their own.

This simple initiative, had a dramatic impact on the community's health. We saw a 90% reduction in COPD cases.

And today, villagers are helping to spread the word, encouraging each other to keep these fireplaces away from their beds.

This is how missions can be both intentional and effective!

## FLOOD CRISIS RELIEF (CHIANGMAI)

Chiangmai was hit by the worst flooding disaster in 40 years. With flood waters reaching 5.2m, and devastating large swaths of Chiangmai. Our relief teams were on station for 3 months, supporting the community and impacted more than 4,453 lives

## COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

An additional 38 emergency workers and community first responders were trained by our teams.
